## Bailey's Prime Plus

Walk past the beautifully monogrammed velvet booths in the main dining room to a striking room that boasts contemporary art hung against striped panels, all lighted with crystal chandeliers and large windows. The result is fresh, sleek and colorful.

**The details:** You may have eaten in this room if you frequent Bailey's — if it's not booked, it's used on busy nights.

Three new fine-dining establishments have raised the bar this year: Brownstone, which opened in June in Fort Worth's new West 7th development, and Bailey's Prime Plus, located just across the street, which opened in April, along with the Renoir Room, added in September to the Sanford House Inn & Spa in Arlington.

Many other more established local restaurants offer private rooms, too, and we've made a handy list of some of the best. You'll find options ranging from tables in wine cellars to window-surrounded spaces in the center of the dining room. Regardless of the theme or size, one element remains constant: You'll get to spend your time celebrating — no cooking or cleaning up. And that definitely makes for a bon appetit.



## Brownstone
